My Trip to Cambodia – An Experience with Glowing Plankton on Koh Rong Samloem (MAY 2019) When the manager at our resort suggested a bioluminescence plankton tour, we immediately got excited and booked the tour. As the evening lights faded that day and the sky became darker, we were anxious to go for our adventure. After some anxious minutes waiting on the beach side, we saw a boat chugging out of dark towards our resort. We were onboard in minutes and Sonia and David our guides and instructors briefed us about planktons. Half an hour later with cool winds in our hair and nerves somewhat calmed, David switched off the boat lights and announced that we would don our snorkels to swim with the plankton. With this declaration, we rushed to look over the side to the black water below, expecting to see the water lit up with the luminescent glow of plankton. It was black. So black that when David laughed and jumped in, assuring us with a flippant, "You'll see", he was soon swallowed into the night. Only the sound of an occasional splash marked his whereabouts. When Sonia said, "Now, it's your turn" I couldn't help but recall an early childhood lesson. My mother wagging her finger at me demanding, "If your sister jumped off a cliff, would you jump too?" Apparently so. We rinsed out our mask and snorkel, stretched it over our heads and took a leap of faith in pitch dark black sea giving the reins of our fate to Sonia. But with my splash and movements, it was dark no longer. It was as if my fingertips, and legs, and toes were sparkling. With every flick of a finger, every twist of a limb, the water brightened and flickered around me with glowing, sparkling, shimmering plankton. I was swimming in a sea of a thousand stars. When I surfaced to look around at my wife, all was quiet and calm as we floated, mesmerized in our own little clouds of sea sparkles.

This was an experience to which any words would not do justice, an experience which we will cherish forever. The calmness and stillness of pitch dark water on the surface and just a flick or your finger under the water and your world turns into a Milky Way. A sight to behold.

Soon after half an hour of playing like kids in the darkness, all our fears were replaced by pure happiness and we were overwhelmed by this wonder of nature which we were lucky enough to experience. And the best thing was, there is no way to capture this experience in any camera or store it in any phone or computer memory except in the most powerful camera that is your eyes and store it in the super computer that is your brain. Thus by the time we were back to our resorts, we couldn't stop talking about it to everyone we met and called and slept with the images of the newly found Milky Way in our dreams forever.

What really is the difference between AR / MR / VR / XR?

Nowadays, new and emerging technology has nurtured an attachment to acronyms, and virtual reality (VR) as well as augmented reality (AR), mixed reality (MR) and extended reality (XR) are not exceptions. The purpose of what follows will be to clarify what is really behind each of these acronyms. It is important to note that these new technologies come from different places and they seek to do different things. Still, they can use some similar technologies. For example, 3D objects and AI(Artificial Intelligence) are important to all of them. So let's look at the concepts and definitions hiding under these words.

Virtual Reality (VR)

Virtual Reality (VR) is an immersive experience also called a computer-simulated reality. It refers to computer technologies using reality headsets to generate the realistic sounds, images and other sensations that replicate a real environment or create an imaginary world. VR is a way to immerse users in an entirely virtual world. A true VR environment will engage all five senses (taste, sight, smell, touch, sound), but it is important to say that this is not always possible.

Today, it is easy to say that VR is a well-established new reality-tech. Moreover, after years of popularity in the gaming industry, we are now seeing this technology into more practical applications. The market and the industry are still excited about this tech trend and further progress is expected in the near future.

Augmented Reality (AR)

Augmented Reality (AR) is a live, direct or indirect view of a physical, real-world environment whose elements are augmented (or supplemented) by computer-generated sensory input such as sound, video, graphics or GPS data. As AR exists on top of our own world it provides as much freedom as you are given within your normal life. AR utilizes your existing reality and adds to it utilizing a device of some sort. Mobile and tablets are the most popular mediums of AR now, through the camera, the apps put an overlay of digital content into the environment. Custom headsets are also being used. As popular AR examples there are Pokemon Go and Snapchat's new AR bitmojis.

Mixed Reality (MR)

Mixed Reality (MR), sometimes referred to as hybrid reality, is the merging of real and virtual worlds to produce new environments and visualizations where physical and digital objects co-exist and interact in real time. It means placing new imagery within a real space in such a way that the new imagery is able to interact, to an extent, with what is real in the physical world we know. The key characteristic of MR is that the synthetic content and the real-world content are able to react to each other in real time.

Extended Reality (XR)

Extended Reality (XR) is a newly added term to the dictionary of the technical words. For now, only a few people are aware of XR. Extended Reality refers to all real-and-virtual combined environments and humanmachine interactions generated by computer technology and wearables. Extended Reality includes all its descriptive forms like the Augmented Reality (AR), Virtual Reality (VR), and Mixed Reality (MR). In other words, XR can be defined as an umbrella, which brings all three Realities (AR, VR, MR) together under one term, leading to less public confusion. Extended reality provides a wide variety and vast number of levels in the Virtuality of partially sensor inputs to Immersive Virtuality.

Since past few years, we have been talking regarding AR, VR, and MR, and probably in coming years, we will be speaking about XR.

5 Nobel Prize winners from India we should know!

The Nobel Prize is an annual international award bestowed on 'those who conferred the greatest benefit on mankind' in the fields of Physics, Chemistry, Physiology, Literature, Peace, and Economics. Nobel Prizes are recognised as the most prestigious honours awarded in the mentioned fields. Rabindranath Tagore was the first Indian citizen to be awarded the award. Among the total recipients, 12 are Indians – 5 Indian citizens and 6 Indian origins or residency. Here are the five Nobel Prize winners from India:

Rabindranath Tagore – **The Nobel Prize in Literature, 1913** - writer, song composer, playwright, essayist and painter – was awarded the prestigious award 'because of his profoundly sensitive, fresh and beautiful verse, by which, with consummate skill, he has made his poetic thought, expressed in his own English words, a part of the literature of the West'. In 1913, he became the first non-European to win the Nobel Prize. National anthems – India's 'Jana Gana Mana' and Bangladesh's 'Amar Shonar Bangla' has been composed by Tagore. National Anthem of Sri Lanka is believed to be inspired from his poetry.

CV Raman – The Nobel Prize in Physics, 1930 - 'For his work on the scattering of light and for the discovery of the effect named after him'. He discovered the 'Raman Effect' – the phenomenon of change in wavelength in light rays that are deflected. It is believed that he was confident of winning the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1928 and 1929 and was disappointed when it went to Owen Richardson and Louis de Broglie, respectively. In 1930, Raman booked his tickets in July even before the announcement of the prize in November.

Mother Teresa – The Nobel Prize in Peace, 1979 - Mother Teresa won the prestigious award 'For work undertaken in the struggle to overcome poverty and distress, which also constitutes a threat to peace'. Born in the Republic of Macedonia, she arrived in India at the age of 19 and began her novitiate in Darjeeling. She spent her life as a Roman Catholic nun and as a missionary serving the poor. She earned the Nobel Prize in 1979. 19 years after her death she was canonized by the Roman Church.

Amartya Sen – The Nobel Prize in Economic Studies, 1998 - In 1998, Amartya Sen was awarded the Nobel Prize in Economic Studies 'for his contributions to welfare economics'. Sen has made contributions to welfare economics, social choice theory, economic and social justice, economic theories of famines, and indices of the measure of wellbeing of citizens in developing countries. His research papers have won him many awards including India's Nobel Memorial Prize (1998), Bharat Ratna (1999) and Johan Skytte Prize (2017), among others.

Kailash Satyarthi – **The Nobel Prize in Peace, 2014** - In 2014, Kailash Satyarthi and Malala Yousafzai were jointly awarded the prestigious award 'for their struggle against the suppression of children and young people and for the right of children to education'. The children's rights activist is the founder of Bachpan Bachao Andolan, the Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, Global March Against Child Labour, and Good Weave International. In 2015, he was featured in Fortune Magazine's 'World's Greatest Leaders' list. His work has won him many national and international honours and awards including the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014, Harvard's University's 'Humanitarian of the Year' award in 2015, Defenders of Democracy Award (US) in 2009, and Gold medal of the Italian Senate in 2007, among others.

Come up with something, a first step, even if it is quite minor, which you can do right now, such as buying a book with information about your goal, attending a lecture, listening to motivating CDs, looking for courses or workshops that can help you improve your life, or any other step that will take you closer to achieving your goal.
- 5. Read inspiring books and articles about people who have attained success in the area of your choice. This will enhance your enthusiasm and motivation.
- 6. Visualize the improvements you want to bring about.
- 7. Keep your desire, enthusiasm and motivation alive, by thinking often how you would like your life to look like.
- 8. Repeat affirmations. They will constantly remind you of your goals, and program your subconscious mind to assist you in achieving them.

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
