## Responsibility on youth to develop image of Nation on global scale: N R Narayan Murthy

*'India gains much importance on global scale. To add to this situation, youth must develop their skills to enhance not only the self career but image of the nation', said Hon'ble N. R. Narayan Murthy, Founder of Infosys while addressing the young graduates as a chief guest at the 17<sup>th</sup> Convocation of Bharati Vidyapeeth University on 5<sup>th</sup> January 2016.*

In the ceremony Dr. Narayan Murthy was conferred upon honorary D.Sc. for his notable work in the IT industry while senior scientist Dr. Raghunath Mashelkar, was also conferred upon D.Sc. for his contribution in science and technology.

Hon'ble Dr. Patangrao Kadam, Founder and Chancellor of Bharati Vidyapeeth University presided over the function. Other dignitaries were Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Shivajirao Kadam, Mr. G. Jayakumar, Registrar, Dean of all faculties, members of management and academic council, students and parents.

Further Narayan Murthy stressed on youth's role in tackling basic issues like illiteracy and corruption and encouraged students to take this responsibility seriously.

Murthy said that India is progressing and different industries like information technology (IT) are attracting foreign direct investments, which is good for the country's

image.

"The country is growing at the rate of 7-7.5 per cent every year while stock exchanges are doing pretty well. According to Forbes magazine, the number of billionaires in India is increasing. Students have this opportunity to contribute but they also have a crucial role to play to maintain this image," Murthy explained.

Further while placing the fact before young graduates he said that over 350 million people do not know reading and writing, above 750 million do not have access to sanitation facilities. This needs to change and it is our youth's responsibility. He cautioned

that achieving it is not an easy task and discipline is required to strictly follow every step.

Addressing the youth as chief guest senior scientist Dr. Raghunath Mashelkar said, "Students should not wait for opportunities rather they should create it. Though everyone is talking about start-ups now, Murthy had done this long ago with Infosys. Students

should learn from it and try to become a job creator rather than a job seeker".

Further he talked about the growth and development of Bharati Vidyapeeth and appreciated the conducive atmosphere for learning and research. He acknowledged the work done by Founder and Chancellor Hon'ble Dr. Patangrao Kadam and asked students to take inspiration from him.

National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) is an initiative constituted under the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India. These rankings were released at the hands of Hon'ble Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani, Minister, MHRD, Government of India in presence of Shri Ved Prakash,

Chairman, UGC, Shri Anil Sahasrabudhe, Chairman, AICTE, Shri Surendra Prasad, Chairman, NBA, Shri Vinay Sheel Oberoi, Secretary (HE), MHRD and Shri A. K. Nasa, Secretary, NBA.

To select the institute under NIRF, a 16-member core committee evaluated the colleges all over India on nearly 22 parameters under five major heads which were Teaching, Learning & Resources (TLR), Research Productivity, Impact & IPR (RPII), Outreach and Inclusivity (OI), Graduation Outcome (GO) and Perception (PR).

Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University's Poona College of Pharmacy secured 4<sup>th</sup> rank in the list of 10 Best Pharmacy Colleges in India and 1<sup>st</sup> in Maharashtra State. While College of Pharmacy, Kolhapur secured 25<sup>th</sup> rank at National level and 5<sup>th</sup> rank in state level in the NIRF scrutiny.

Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering Pune was ranked 61<sup>st</sup> among the Engineering institutions at the national level and 4<sup>th</sup> in Maharashtra. College secured the position in Criteria wise ranking by getting 5<sup>th</sup> Rank in Graduation Outcome (GO), 13<sup>th</sup> Rank in Outreach & Inclusivity (OI), 44<sup>th</sup> Rank in Teaching-Learning & Resources (TLR) and 62<sup>nd</sup> Rank in Perception (PR).

# Brett Lee at Bharati Vidyapeeth, Pune - Satara Road Campus



An orientation program to create awareness on 'Hearing Loss and Cochlear Implant: A Global Scenario' was conducted on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2016 by the School of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology and Bharati Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune.

The Chief Guest for the program was Cricket legend Mr. Brett Lee, who is the first Global hearing Ambassador of Cochlear Pvt. Ltd. Guest of Honor for the program was Hon'ble Dr. Vishwajeet Kadam, Secretary, Bharati Vidyapeeth, Pune. Dignitaries present for the program were Dr. Asmita Jagtap, Executive Director, Bharati Hospital, Dr. V.N. Karandikar, Director, Medical Sciences, Dr. S. Lalwani, Director Medical Hospital and Dr. Vivek Saoji, Principal Medical College. The students and staff of the School of Audiology and Speech

Language pathology attended the program. On this occasion Mr. Brett Lee shared his experience on serving as a global ambassador for hearing and emphasized the importance of early identification and intervention for children with hearing loss.

Lee talked about his own experience when his son suffered hearing loss in one ear due to a head injury. Though he regained it after 18 months, as a parent, he was so tensed.

Further he added that hearing loss is a huge public health issue globally and he cannot imagine cricket without sound - on the field, the appeals and the crowd. Lee asked to spread awareness about hearing impairment. Parents should take their newborns for screening after birth to identify any kind of

hearing loss. It should no longer be a stigma and people who cannot hear can get it rectified with Cochlear Implants. Regular hearing check up can help overcome the problem.

He also spent some quality time with children using Cochlear Implants and undergoing post implantation rehabilitation at BVDUSASLP. The program concluded with a prize distribution ceremony for the winners of a quiz competition on the theme: Hearing loss and Cochlear Implant. With the dignitaries audience took the following oath: "I solemnly pledge to create awareness and help people with hearing loss so that their dignity, integrity and rights are protected in the Society. Lets break the barrier and open the gates towards inclusive society."

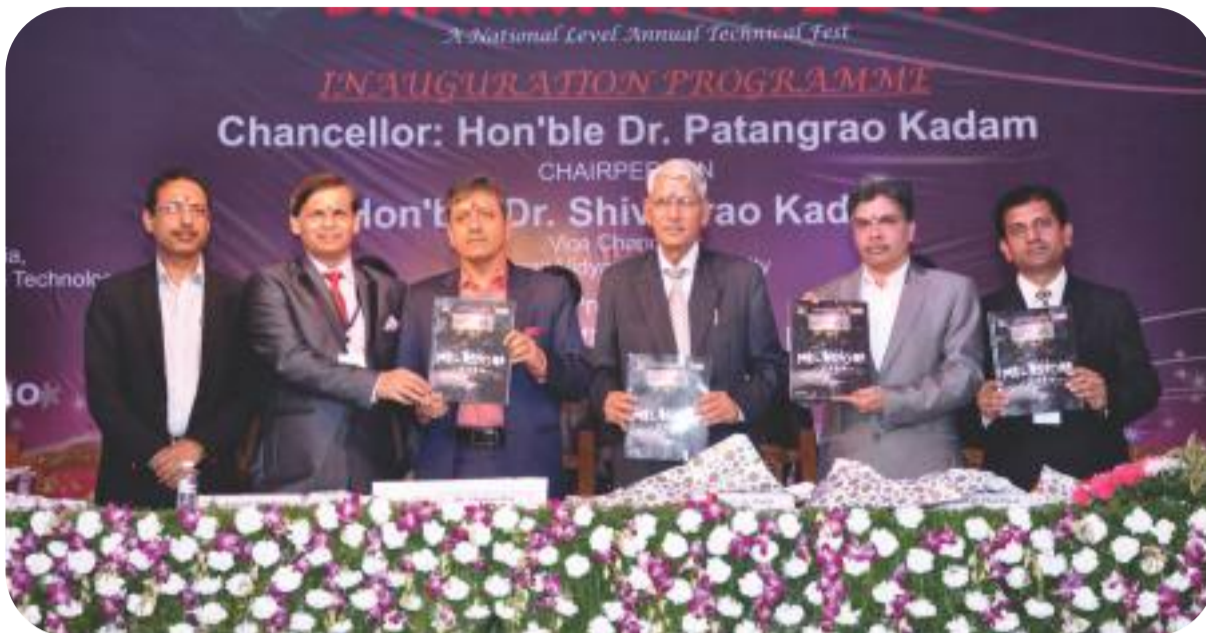
